DMPS, like all government schools, provides students with free instruction to fulfil the standard Victorian curriculum and we want to assure you that some contributions are voluntary. Nevertheless, the ongoing support of our families ensures that our school can offer the best possible education and support for our students.

We want to thank you for all your support, whether that's through fundraising, volunteering your time, or making payments for school programs and excursions. This has made a huge difference to our school and the variety of rich and rewarding programs we can offer. Within our school this support has allowed us to organise and coordinate the best possible programs outside of the traditional teaching and learning classroom structure. These financial contributions assist us with the purchasing of art, science and physical education equipment and resources, cooking ingredients and gardening supplies for the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden program, and enhanced digital learning opportunities including 1:1 devices for every student.

Please find attached DMPS's financial contribution schedule for 2023. Please note – there will be no individual book packs required to be purchased for students in 2023. As in previous years, all necessary consumable items will be supplied directly to classrooms in bulk and will be distributed to students as and when they are needed. This system works very effectively at DMPS as long as our families make these voluntary contributions.

As these items are paid, the charge will be removed from the home page. We hope this will help families access current fee information whenever required. Financial Support for Families

Deans Marsh Primary School understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

- the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund provides \$125 per year to help eligible families to cover the cots of school trips, camps, and sporting activities. If you have a valid meanstested concession card or Pensioner Concession Card, or are a temporary foster parent you may be eligible. If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to reapply each year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office and ask for an application form.
- State School Relief provides financial support for eligible families to purchase clothing/uniforms at a reduced rate. SSR also provide a winter package for eligible Prep students.

Payment methods

For the 2023 school year, Deans Marsh Primary School Council has approved the Curriculum Contributions, Other Contributions and Extra-Curricular Items to be collected via one of the following methods:

- Cash
- Direct deposit to the school's bank account NAB 083001 / 988238739 (please note this is a new bank account)
- BPAY please contact the school or refer to your contribution reminder statement for your individual family BPAY reference number
- Compass
- EFTPOS (new in 2023!)

Compass will allow parents to select which fee items they would like payments to be allocated against. There is also an option to make payments via a payment plan in Compass. Please note – 2023 Curriculum Contributions will not be visible in Compass until 2023.

All other payments will be allocated chronologically with older invoices paid first. If you wish payments to be allocated differently to this process, please email the school <u>deans.marsh.ps@education.vic.gov.au</u> prior to making the payment.

Refunds

Parent requests for refunds are subject to the discretion of the school and made on a case-bycase basis. Refunds will be provided where the school deems it is reasonable and fair to do so, taking into consideration whether a cost has been incurred, the Department's Parent Payment Policy and Guidance, Financial Help for Families Policy and any other relevant information.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements in Victorian Curriculum F-10, VCE and VCAL.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the

Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).

FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

 Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
